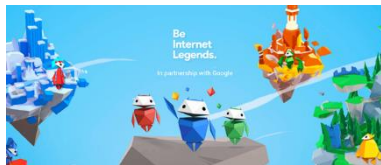

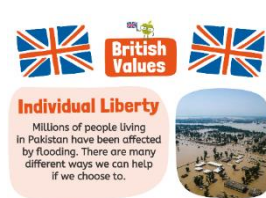
Picture News- Article 17
